## Using Compaq Diagnostics to Inspect SYSTEMPROs and SYSTEMPRO/LTs

The Compaq Diagnostics diskette contains an Inspect utility that provides detailed information about Compaq SYSTEMPROs and SYSTEMPRO/LTs. For example, the INSPECT utility will display all the specifications about the processor, bus type, numeric coprocessor, ROM versions for video and keyboard controller, memory configuration, just to name a few items.

The most recent copy of the Diagnostic utility, version 8.05, is available from "FsPatches@CTS50@Servers." Change to the subdirectory that matches your floppydrive format: COMPAQ\DIAGS8.05\3\_5 or COMPAQ\DIAGS8.05\5.25; insert a DOS system-formatted high-density diskette into your floppy drive; and run QRST, a utility that will copy the DIAGNOSTICS onto your diskette.

## Note before starting:

--Follow the steps after hours, if at all possible. --Disconnect your server from the WAN before rebooting so that it will initialize faster.

- From the server console, choose option <4> to "Shut down server software." Answer "Y" to shut down all services, and either "Y" or "N" to notify or not notify users. At the Shut-down menu, select "Prepare Server for Power-off/Reboot."
- 2. Disconnect your SYSTEMPRO from the WAN (if it's a server).
- 3. Insert the Compaq Diagnostics diskette (version 8.04 or higher ONLY) into the SYSTEMPRO's floppy drive and press <Ctrl><Alt><Del> to reboot.
- 4. Press <ENTER> to continue at the "Welcome" screen to get to the Diagnostics 8.05 Menu.
- 5. Select "Inspect Computer."
- 6. When INSPECT has completed, press <F8> to save the information to diskette. Name the file according to your file server's name (example: CTS50.INS). Remove the diskette from the drive when INSPECT has finished copying the file.
- 7. Press <F3> to exit, select "Exit from this utility," then "Exit" once again to reboot the machine.
- 8. Remove the Diagnostics diskette and store it in a safe place.
- 9. When all services are "running", reconnect to the WAN.
- 10. Examine the text file created, print for your records, or follow other instructions regarding the distribution of the file.
